A spectrum of activities







- Overall lack of description and evaluation of participation in practice
- Research evidence does not capture or reflect range of practice
- 'Participation' is evident in existing practice models but not always explicit
- Replicability?





- Young people talk about relationships, not participation
- Voluntary engagement


Hub and Spoke Participation The 2016 Diary

The Hub and Spoke project has an additional strand of work that focuses on participation with young people. This aims to investigate and support ways for young people to be actively involved in Hub and Spoke services.

As part of this, we decided to organise an event for a group of Hub and Spoke services that involved young people in discussing what their experiences of 'participation' in <u>cse</u> services had been – and what they thought it should be.

This is our diary of what happened. In writing this we have tried to be honest about the bumps in the road, and what happened in the end. It is important to note that it is not a guide, and that the issues will vary for different people in other circumstances. At the same time, the issues that are raised in this diary are familiar themes in the research and practice literature, though they are often glossed over in phrases such as 'it proved challenging to maintain the involvement of young people in the sample' or 'there was a high drop-out rate owing to the individual circumstances of young people'. Having been guilty of such obfuscation in the past, the diary aims to get behind the scenes – and we hope this will help you in thinking about talking to young people and involving them in your service.





Talking to practitioners: what does participation mean in practice?

'[Participation] was central this service from the start, it's part of the DNA.' (service manager)

'Feedback comes in every three months – they are asked about feedback. So there is feedback on support throughout support process, not just at end.' (staff member)





What makes participation happen?

- An organisational commitment to a participatory approach
- Time, resources and inclusivity
- Organisational arrangements that enable, rather than obstruct, involvement in individual decision making
- Staff with appropriate skills, knowledge and compassion
- A flexible and creative approach to what participation means

Vote for the topics you would like to discuss at the learning eschange.


Next steps for participation...




"It is tough work and I think the role requires a real high level of resilience and you've got to really want to do it, there can't be any doubt in people's minds and it does take its toll"


